Entrance to the Festival Literature Village and Play at the Castle at Newark Castle is free; you simply buy tickets to the individual events you wish to see.

Newark is easily accessible from all over the UK by train, bus and car. There are two train stations in Newark: Newark Northgate and Newark Castle. Both are within walking distance to Newark Town Hall, the main hub of the festival.
